## Requirements

- Presentation of Action Plan is MANDATORY for Virtual 2022 NC FPS State Bowl participants. Booklets submitted for the GIPS competition that are not accompanied by a PAP submission are not eligible for award.
  - GIPS teams that do not submit a Presentation of Action Plan will NOT be able to advance in the booklet competition.
  - GIPS Individuals may join a team.
- This is very open-ended! Choose a format that provides the ability to collaborate and work together given environmental constraints. Whatever students are excited about in terms of format is encouraged, provided it is feasible and shareable on YouTube and **responds to the score sheet**.
- ONLY the GIPS team (and up to 7-members who are registered Individual, Scenario, or CmPS 2021 NC FPS State Bowl attendees) can prepare the presentation.

AWARDS for all PAP members will be mailed to the coordinator on the registration!

The UP and **Action Plan SUMMARY** must be read at the beginning of the recording, prior to the Presentation of Action Plan itself. This **will not count** toward the 4-minute limit! Please **keep summaries to 200 words or less**.

Some creative options for student submissions may include:

- Video of traditional skit performance (max 4 min)
- Video project using original audio/visual – editing is okay/encouraged! (4 minutes max)
  - Recorded PowerPoint
  - Stop Motion Animation
  - Screencast of gameplay, etc.
  - Credits and/or title screens (with no school affiliations or names)
  - Record a Zoom call
  - Captioned non-verbal video
  - Other creative ideas too!
- Audio recording/presentation/dramatic presentation (max 4 min)

**ALL WORK IN THE PRESENTATION MUST be the student's original creation and not copyright materials (characters, music, etc.). This aligns with our Statement of Authenticity that each Participant and parent has signed.**

**GIPS Team:** Submit 1 Presentation of Action Plan; all or part of the team, *including a single team member*, can be part of the submitted Presentation of Action Plan. Teams can add others, up to 7

people total (as already established). **Members of PAP can be from GIPS Individuals, Scenario Writing, or Community Problem Solving – but MUST be registered for 2022 NC FPS State Bowl.**

## Timeline

- Mandatory props and quotes will be placed in Coach’s Google State Bowl folder after the GIPS competition on Friday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> and posted on [www.ncfps.org](http://www.ncfps.org) . (Mandatory props may not be found in every house since we have non-virtual participants. If a prop is not owned, teams are NOT expected to purchase these props. Use a comparable stand-in and introduce the switch after the UP/AP summary but before the skit begins.)
- **Submissions are due by Saturday, April 23rd at 11:30 am EDT** – Presentation of Action Plans will be submitted via Google Form as unlisted YouTube links. ***NO late submissions will be accepted.***

- **Honor Code:** Create and submit videos made ONLY by members of the up to 7-person team and affiliated parents/coaches!

## Suggested Resource List

Physical or digital versions of the following items may be used:

- 1 roll of tape
- pens/pencils
- 10 sheets of 8 1/2 x 11 or A4 paper (colored, newspaper, blank, lined, used, or otherwise)
- 12 pipe cleaners
- 1 roll of aluminum foil
- 1 magazine
- 1 set of 8 water-soluble colored markers
- 1 cloth towel
- 1 cardboard box
- 1 pillowcase
- Appropriate handmade costumes are acceptable (face make-up/painting is acceptable for virtual Presentations of Action Plan as well)
- Up to 4 chairs may (safely) be utilized

\*Note: students do not need to use every prop on this resource list; additional items should NOT be added.

## Evaluation

- Scoresheet is found at the end of this document.
- Round 1 will follow an adjusted score sheet.
- Only one round will be evaluated
  - Three evaluators will provide scores, which will determine ranking in each division

- Penalties will be tabulated (participants – please follow guidelines to avoid actions that result in penalties)
- Score sheets will be available with GIPS results.
